Our utility workers risk their lives to electrify the homes of city residents while our gas construction workers address dangerous gas leaks and keep our gas distribution and transmission system safe for the public. Local 465 represents workers at the following properties: San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E), Metropolitan Transit System, San Diego Trolley, NRG, Imperial Irrigation District, Davey Tree, and Utility Tree Service.

ABOUT IBEW 569



IBEW Local Union 569 represents 3,400 working families throughout San Diego and Imperial Counties. Our members are electricians who work in construction building projects like schools, hospitals and renewable energy. With industry partners, we own and operate the San Diego and Imperial Electrical Training Centers where we provide electrical apprenticeship training with good wages, family healthcare, retirement benefits and college credits. Our apprenticeship and union recruit talent from the local community including high schools and veteran programs.

IBEW AND CLIMATE CHANGE

IBEW 465 and 569 support strong action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and address our climate crisis. With smart policies, we can transition to a sustainable economy that lifts up working families and strengthens our middle-class. Our members are on the cutting-edge of renewable energy and green technologies. To ensure green jobs create pathways into the middle-class, it is essential to link policy with programs and projects. Local Hire Agreements, joint labor-management apprenticeship partnering, workforce safety standards and certifications and responsible contractor criteria are some of the policy tools decision makers can employ to create family-sustaining jobs that provide upward mobility and career opportunities. We support investing in mass transit to take cars off the roads, expanding electric vehicles, repairing gas leaks and moving towards more sustainable sources of power generation.

With careful planning and the right policy provisions, the City of San Diego's requirement for 100% renewable energy by 2035 presents an exciting opportunity to address climate change, create and sustain middle-class jobs and expand work opportunities for IBEW members.
