WHAT AN ENDORSEMENT MEANS:

IBEW 569 arrived at these endorsements through a rigorous and democratic process whereby IBEW 569 Legislative Committee members and delegates participated at the local level through interviews with the San Diego County Building & Construction Trades Council and/or the San Diego & Imperial Counties Labor Council endorsement processes as well as at the state level through the California State Building Trades Council and the California Labor Federation. These processes included research on candidates, interviews of candidates, and votes by delegate and executive board bodies to determine whether a candidate or ballot measure should receive a labor endorsement.

Candidates must demonstrate that they support the values and work of IBEW 569, labor unions and our members. Our #1 priority in determining who receives the endorsement of IBEW 569 is whether the candidate or the initiative will result in more work for our members with higher wages, and a better quality of life.

Our Union endorsed these candidates, and we ask you to vote for them.

If there is a race or issue that is not on this card, but is on your ballot, it means candidates or advocates for the issue did not seek or receive an endorsement from the San Diego & Imperial Building Trades Councils or the San Diego & Imperial Counties Labor Council. It can also mean the Councils chose not to endorse in those races.

If you recently moved, changed your name, or want to change your political party, you need to re-register to vote. You should be registered to vote at least 15 days before an election. You can register to vote online at <http://registertovote.ca.gov/>. You can check your voter status at voterstatus.sos.ca.gov.

Tuesday, November 8, 2022 is the deadline to register to vote in person. To register to vote in person, you must go to the Registrar of Voters office at 5600 Overland Ave, San Diego, CA 92123. Complete a conditional voter registration form and submit it. You will get a ballot and a green CVR provisional envelope. Mark your choices on the ballot, place it in the envelope, and seal it. Print and sign your name, and date the envelope. Once your conditional voter registration form is verified and it is confirmed you did not vote elsewhere in the state for the current election, your vote will be counted and your registration will become active.

WHO CAN VOTE? To register to vote in California, you must: be a citizen of the United States; be a resident of California; be at least 18 or older on Election Day; not be currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony; and not be currently found to be mentally incompetent to vote by a court.
